

# Yamāri's influence on Tibetan Buddhist Logic

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Yamāri was a Buddhist Logician in old India who wrote a lengthy commentary on Prajñākaragupta's *Pramāṇavārttikālamkāra*. Even though until now little attention has been given to Yamāri's thought,<sup>1)</sup> it strongly influenced Tibetan Buddhist Logic. Recent Scholarship, however, has begun a significant reevaluation of Yamāri's contribution. For example, E. Stainkellner has argued that 'tshad ma skye bu', a very important term for Tibetan Buddhist Logicians, is derived from Yamāri's commentary.<sup>2)</sup> The Purpose of this paper is to investigate other examples.

(I) The Ordering of Chapters in the *Pramāṇavārttika*

Go ram pa bSod nam seng ge (1429-1489)
